REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS (RFQ) FOR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I. PURPOSE AND INTENT

Through this Request for Qualifications (RFQ), the Camden County Municipal Joint Insurance Fund (hereinafter the "Fund") seeks to engage a Service Provider as **Executive Director** for the 2024, 2025 and 2026 fund years commencing January 1, 2024 or upon appointment, whichever is later. This contract will be awarded through a fair and open process pursuant to NJSA 19:44A-20.4 et seq. and complies with the best practices recommended by Office of the State Controller.

II. PROPOSAL SUBMISSION

This Request for Qualifications is to solicit professional services. All documents and information submitted in response to this solicitation shall be available to the general public as required by the New Jersey Open Public Records Act N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1 et seq. The Fund will not be responsible for any costs associated with the oral or written and/or presentation of the proposals. The Fund reserves the right to reject any and all proposals in whole or in part and waive such informalities as may be permitted by law. The Fund further reserves the right to make such investigations as it deems necessary as to the qualifications of any and all vendors submitting proposals. The fund reserves the right to negotiate contracts for such services and seek amendments to any proposal.

III. GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE FUNCTIONS OF THE FUND

The Fund is organized pursuant to NJSA 40A: 10-36 to provide property/casualty insurance to its member local units. The Fund also provides its members with a comprehensive risk control and claims management program. The Fund is controlled by Board of Fund Commissioners that annually elects an executive committee. The Fund is regulated by the Department of Banking and Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs.

IV. MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

See Exhibit A

V. SCOPE OF SERVICES

See "SERVICES" section of the contract attached in Exhibit C, which sets forth a representative listing of the services to be provided under this contract. Responder's fee proposal should be based on the representative listing of services in Exhibit C. To the extent a responder proposes modifications to the services, they should clearly describe the modifications and the impact, if any, on the fee proposal. The Camden County Municipal JIF reserves the right, in the best interests of the Camden County Municipal JIF, to make modifications to the scope of services based upon the RFQ responses received.

VI. MANDATORY CONTENTS OF PROPOSAL

In its proposal, the responder must include the following:

- 1) Contact Information: Provide the name and address of the firm, the name, telephone number, fax number, and e-mail address of the individual responsible for the preparation of the proposal.
- 2) A fee proposal for the 2024 fund year. The responder shall also include either a fee proposal for the 2025 and 2026 fund years or a statement that: "The responder agrees it will accept any fee adjustment the Fund makes at the Fund's sole discretion to Service Provider fees for the 2025 and 2026 fund years reflecting changes in Fund's membership, changes in economic condition of the Fund's members and changes in the consumer price index."
- 3) A statement detailing how the responder meets minimum qualifications in Exhibit A. List the first item in the exhibit followed with the specific response, followed with the next item and the response, and so on. Also include a staffing plan listing those persons who will be assigned to the engagement if selected, including the designation of the person who would be the responder's officer responsible for all services required under the engagement. This portion of the proposal should include the relevant resume information for the individuals who will be assigned.

This information shall further include, at a minimum, a description of the person's relevant professional experience, years and type of experience, and number of years with the responder.

The responder must complete the Political Disclosure statement, Non-Collusion Certificate, Statement of Ownership Disclosure and Prohibited Activities in Russia-Belarus & Iran Investment Activities attached as Exhibits D, E, F & G.

- 4) A description of the responder's experience in performing services of the type described in this RFQ. Specifically identify client size and specific examples of similarities with the scope of services required under this RFQ.
- 5) A description concerning specific and quantifiable cost savings the responder can demonstrate from similar engagements and the rational why the Fund should consider this experience when evaluating the responder's cost proposal.
- 6) A description of resources of the responder (i.e., background, location, experience, staff resources, financial resources, other resources, etc.).
- 7) The location of the office or offices at which the responder proposes to perform services required under this RFQ. Specifically, the responder must state in its proposal whether or not the responder is registered as a small business enterprise ("SBE") with the New Jersey Commerce and Economic Growth Commission New Jersey's Set-Aside Program.
- 8) At least five references including the contact names, titles and phone numbers.
- 9) Any existing or potential conflicts of interest. Disclose any representation of parties or other relationships that might be considered a conflict of interest with regard to this engagement, or the Fund.
- 10) Contract will be in accordance with NJAC 17:44-2.2 which requires all vendors to maintain all documentation related to the services provided for a period of five years from the date of final payment. Records to be made available to the state office of comptroller upon request.

VII. EVALUATION COMMITTEE

The Contracts Review committee shall serve as the "Evaluation Committee" for this RFQ.

VIII. INTERVIEW & CLARIFICATION

The Fund reserves the right but has no obligation to interview any or all of the responders and the right to request clarifying information subsequent to submission of the proposal.

IX. SELECTION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

All proposals will be reviewed to determine responsiveness. Non-responsive proposals will be rejected without evaluation. For responders that satisfy the minimum requirements, the Evaluation Committee will consider the management of the engagement, technical criteria, cost and the experience of the responder. See Exhibit B for the specific evaluation criteria.

X. CONTRACT

The contract between the Fund and the selected vendor(s) shall be comprised the contract attached as Exhibit C, this RFQ, any clarifications or addenda thereto, the selected vendor's proposal, and any changes negotiated by the parties.

Exhibit A – Minimum Qualifications

Executive Director:

- 1. The responder shall demonstrate a consistent pattern of providing leadership to joint insurance or self-insured governmental entities and must quantify the results achieved.
- 2. The responder shall demonstrate experience and knowledge of:
 - a. Management of a governmental entity;
 - b. Regulations of the Department of Banking and Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs;
 - c. The Open Public Records Act and regulations pertaining to the retention of public documents:
 - d. The Public Contracts Act and best practices for procurement of goods and services;
 - e. Workers' compensation, liability and property matters involving governmental entities;
 - f. Financial matters pertaining to joint insurance funds including budgets, assessments, monitoring reports, investments, audit controls, fund year accounting and closed fund year accounting;
 - g. Development of risk management training programs and materials; and
 - h. Legislative and public relations.
- 3. The responder shall designate the following minimum personnel for the engagement.
 - a. A senior officer who will be designated as Executive Director with experience as an Executive Director for a joint insurance fund or similar experience;
 - b. A senior officer who will be designated as Deputy Executive Director with experience as an Executive Director or Deputy Executive Director for a joint insurance fund or similar experience;
 - c. An officer with experience as Chief Financial Officer of a joint insurance fund or similar experience;
 - d. An officer with experience as the Director of Claims with a joint insurance fund or similar experience;
 - e. An officer with experience as an Assistant Secretary for a joint insurance fund or similar experience; and
 - f. A Director of Budgets and Systems with experience with a joint insurance fund or similar experience;
- 4. The responder shall have the computer systems required to operate a joint insurance fund including functions for budgets, assessments, monitoring reports, investments, audit controls, fund year accounting and closed fund year accounting;
- 5. The responder shall not be engaged as or have an interest in a service provider to a joint insurance fund in competition with the Fund.

Adjustments to compensation for Fund year 2025 and 2026 will be established by the Board of Fund Commissioners at annual reorganization.

Payment shall be made in monthly installments provided the SERVICE PROVIDER submits a duly authorized voucher at least 10 days prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the FUND's Executive Committee.

Furthermore, this payment schedule is subject to any rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs.

It is agreed that new members shall be charged a fee in proportion to the fee charged to current members of the FUND.

The SERVICE PROVIDER may voucher for unanticipated work assignments provided such work has been authorized by the FUND's Executive Committee.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS – SERVICES: In addition to services detailed in the FUND's bylaws, plan of risk management, and N.J.A.C. 11:15-2 etc. seq the SERVICE PROVIDER will:

During the term of this Agreement, the SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide the services of at least two senior insurance professionals satisfactory to the FUND's Executive Committee with at least ten years of insurance experience including, but not limited to, municipal risk management. One senior partner shall serve as Executive Director/Administrator, with the other senior partner and/or officer serving as Deputy Executive Director/Administrator(s). The SERVICE PROVIDER shall also provide all necessary staff support to the Executive Director/Administrator and Deputy Executive Director/Administrator(s).

The SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide the following services:

The Administrator shall act as the Executive Director/Administrator to carry out the policies established by the FUND Commissioners/Executive Committee, and to otherwise administer and provide for the day-to-day management of the FUND.

Annually prepare and distribute for the FUND a <u>Members' Manual</u> which shall include, at the very minimum, the following documents: Policy and Procedures Manual, Plan of Risk Management, Coverage Documents, and Fund Bylaws.

Maintain the FUND's underwriting files, prepare budgets, and compile and bill assessments.

Prepare new members' submissions for review by the FUND Commissioners/Executive Committee, and supply underwriting data to FUND professionals as needed.

Maintain the FUND's general ledger and accounts payable.

Coordinate the FUND's meetings, agendas, minutes, elections, and contracts, as well as maintain the FUND's official records and offices.

Prepare request for proposals for services such as claims administration, safety engineering, actuarial, and other areas as deemed by the FUND.

Prepare all filings required by state regulators.

Attend all meetings of the Executive Committee.

Assume overall executive responsibility for the operation of the FUND, except that the Executive Director/Administrator shall not be responsible for the errors and omissions of any other servicing organization except as to generally monitor the compliance of said organization with the directions of the FUND Commissioners/Executive Committee, or performance in accordance with their professional services agreement with the FUND, or the applicable statutes and regulations as to the form and timeliness of said undertakings by the contracted professional.

To professionally perform such other duties as may be determined by the FUND's Executive Committee, by the FUND's Bylaws, N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36 et. seq., and N.J.A.C. 11:15-2 et. seq.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO COMPENSATION. The compensation or service fee set forth in Appointment and Special Provisions – Services Clauses of this Agreement includes:

All administrative staff including support staff necessary to assist the FUND Secretary in the taking and dissemination of Minutes and keeping of FUND records.

Use of all physical equipment, and there shall be no further charges for rent, light, heat, office equipment or similar items.

In-house computer services including all software and hardware provided by the SERVICE PROVIDER to maintain complete underwriting data on all member municipalities, and compute experience modification factors, budgets and assessments, it being understood that the software is and shall remain the property of the SERVICE PROVIDER. All data and records which pertain to the business and activities of the FUND shall, however, be the property of the FUND. Upon request of the FUND's Executive Committee, the SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide a complete and current copy of all such data and records to the FUND's Executive Committee in either hard copy or on computer tape or disk or both as requested by the FUND's Executive Committee subject, however, to the capability of the SERVICE PROVIDER's computer.

The service fee specified herein does not include expenses for services contracted or items purchased specifically for FUND use, such as FUND letterhead, telephone and postage for "general" mailing and other similar expense, including off premise record storage. All such items shall be subject to reimbursement in accordance with policies established and modified from time to time by the FUND's Executive Committee.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS - OTHER OBLIGATIONS.

The SERVICE PROVIDER will provide all necessary supervision for the FUND in compliance with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and policies governing the administration of the FUND. The SERVICE PROVIDER will act as the representative of the FUND in all matters relating to such administration. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall also advise the FUND's Executive Committee on Risk Management matters, coordinate the activities of other officials appointed by the FUND and report to the FUND's Executive Committee in a timely manner.

SPECIAL PROVISION: INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS: The Indemnification & Hold Harmless section in the Standard Provisions is replaced in its entirety by the following:

As set forth in the FUND's Bylaws, the FUND shall indemnify the SERVICE PROVIDER, its affiliates and subsidiaries for claims arising from an act or omission of said SERVICE PROVIDER, providing the act occurs within the scope of the performance of such individuals' duties as SERVICE PROVIDER.

Such indemnification shall include reasonable cost and expenses incurred in defending such claim. Nothing contained herein shall require the FUND to pay punitive or exemplary damages or damages arising from the commission of a crime by the SERVICE PROVIDER, and the FUND shall not be required to provide for the defense or indemnification of the SERVICE PROVIDER when the act or omission which caused the injury was the result of actual fraud, malice, gross negligence or willful misconduct of the SERVICE PROVIDER.

The FUND agrees to indemnify, protect, save and keep harmless the SERVICE PROVIDER, its affiliates and subsidiaries from any and all loss, cost, damage or expenses arising from:

Any financial obligation to contribute to the FUND's loss payment FUND or provide FUNDs for any payments due municipal member.

The negligent acts or omissions of the FUND and its municipal member.

The execution of policies approved by the FUND.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS: CONFIDENTIALITY of PROPRIETARY INFORMATION.

The Proprietary Information section in the Standard Provisions is replaced in its entirety by the following:

The SERVICE PROVIDER shall not reveal to any third party any information which the FUND has defined as <u>proprietary</u> without the express written consent of the FUND. Failure to comply with these requirements shall represent cause for termination of this agreement, in accordance with Section III of this agreement.

It is further agreed that SERVICE PROVIDER does not have discretionary authority or discretionary control respecting management of the FUND, does not exercise any authority or control respecting management or disposition of the assets of the FUND and does not render investment advice with respect to any monies of the FUND and has no authority to do so. The full function of SERVICE PROVIDER is to provide the services described herein, and SERVICE PROVIDER shall have absolutely no financial responsibility or other liability for any payment of benefits or to the FUND's fund.

Unless otherwise provided, the following provisions shall apply to the SERVICE AGREEMENT between the SERVICE PROVIDER and the FUND

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS: SERVICE PROVIDER shall indemnify, defend and hold the FUND, its Commissioners, appointed officials and member municipalities harmless from any and all claims or liabilities arising out of the activities of the SERVICE PROVIDER, its employees and agents in connection with all activities undertaken by the SERVICE PROVIDER, pursuant to this Agreement. It is the intention of the parties that any claim for relief of a ny type being a sserted against the FUND, its Commissioners, appointed officials and member municipalities, based upon any act or om ission of the SERVICE PROVIDER, its affiliates and successors, shall be the responsibility of the SERVICE PROVIDER, and t he SERVICE PROVIDER shall hold the FUND harmless from

INSURANCE: SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide, at its own cost and expense, proof of the following minimum insurance to the FUND:

Workers' Compensation: Statutor y plus \$100,000/\$500,000/\$100,000 for employers' liability:

General Liability: \$1,000,000/\$2,000,000 CSL for bodily injury, property damage, and personal injury:

Automobile Liability: \$1,000,000 CSL covering all owned/non-owned, and hired automobiles:

Professional Liability Insurance: \$1,000,000/ \$1,000,000 aggregate:

Bond: If required b y the by-laws or pursuant to NJAC 11:15-2 et seq., The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be bonded in a form an d amount acceptable to the FUND's governin g body

Failure by the SERVICE PROVIDER to supply written evidence of these coverages shall result in default. It is required that, wherever possible, the FUND be named as an "additional named insured" on any certificate of insurance The insurance companies for the above cov erages must be licensed, solvent and accepta ble to the FUND. SERVICE PROVIDER shall not take any action to cancel or materially change any of the above insurance required under this Agreement without FUND approval.

Maintenance of insurance und er this section shall not relieve SERVICE PROVIDER of any liability greater than the insurance coverage.

POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS: Compliance with the New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditur es

Reporting Act. N.J. S.A. 19:44A-1 et seg. shall be material term and condition of this contract and shall be binding upon the parties hereto upon execution of this Contract. The following provision only applies to the SERVICE PROVIDER if the appointment was not made pursuant to a f air and open pr ocess in accordance with N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et seq. By acceptance of this Agreement, the SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that in the one year period preceding the date that this contract is legally authorized that neither the SERVICE PROVIDER business entity nor any persons holding 10% or more of the issued and outstanding stock of the SERVICE PROVIDER business entity or entitled to receive the benefit of 10% or more of the revenues and/or profits of the SERICE PROVIDER business entity have made an y reportable contributions pursuant to N.J. S.A. 19:44A-1 et seq. that, pursuant to P.L. 2004, c.19 wo uld bar the award of this contract. This includes any reportable contribution to any official, candidate, joint candidates committee or political party representing elected officials or candidates as defined pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-3(p), (q) and (r) of any member local unit insured by the FUND. Further, the SERVICE PROVIDER and all persons holding 10% or more of the issued and outstand ing stock of the SERVICE PROVIDER business entit y or entitled to receive the benefit of 10% or more of the revenues and/or profits of the SERVICE PROVIDER business entity shall not make such contributions during the period of this contract.

TERMINATION: The FUND may terminate t his Agreement, at any time during the term thereof by the giving of ninety (90) days written notice, setting forth the cause or causes for termination to the SERVICE PROVIDER. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall have the opportunity for a hearing before the FUND's Executive Committee. The FUND's Executive Committee shall determine whether the reasons for the termination can be amicably and reasonably resolved or whether, in its sole determination, the Agreement shall be terminated. The SERVICE PROVIDER may terminate this Agreement, at any time during the term thereof, by the giving of ninety (90) days written notice.

OWNERSHIP OF RECORDS: All records and data of any kind relating to the FUND shall belong to the FUND, and shall be sur rendered to the FUND upon expiration or termination of this Agreement. At all times during the term of this Agreement and for a period of five (5) years, from the date of final payment, the FUND, its appointed officials and other designated representatives, as authorized by the FUND, shall have access to records and files maintained by the SERVICE PROVIDER for the FUND during normal business hours. Furthermore, such records, books, and files relating to the operation and business of the FUND are the property of the FUND, regardless of site stored. Information released to the SERVICE PROVIDER by the

FUND for the purpose of performing the services as outlined herein shall be used only in connection with the performance of said duties. In addition, Records must be made available to the state of fice of comptroller upon request.

PAYMENT: Payment shall be made in monthly installments (unless otherwise specified), provided the SERVICE PROVIDER submits a duly authorized voucher at least 10 days prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the FUND's governing body. Final Payment will be withheld until the vendor's continued service is determined. If the vendor's contract will not be renewed or is terminated – final payment will not be made until all provisions of the contract have been satisfied.

This payment schedule is subject to any rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Banking & Insurance and the Department of Community Affairs.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS RELATING TO COMPENSATION. The compensation or service fee set forth in this Agreement includes:

All administrative staff, including support staff, necessary to perform the work required of the SERVICE PROVIDER.

Use of all physical equipment, and there shall be no further charges for rent, light, heat, office equipment or similar items.

In-house computer's ervices including all software and hardware provided by the SERVICE PROVIDER for the FUND's use, it being u nderstood that the sof tware and hardware is and shall remain the property of the SE RVICE PROVIDER. BINDING ON SUCCE SSORS AND AS SIGNS: Except as otherwise provided herein , all terms, provisions and conditions of this Agreement shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their respective personal representatives, successors and assigns.

NO ASSIGNMENT: the SERVICE PROVIDER shall not assign This Agreement without the specific written consent of the FUND.

PARTIAL INVALIDITY: If any term, provision or condition contained in this Agreement, or the application thereof to any person or circumstances shall, at any time, or to any extent, be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of such term or provision to persons or circumstances ot her than those as to which this Agreement is invalid or unenforceable, shall not be affected thereby, and e ach term, provision or condition contained in this Agreement shall be valid and enforced to the fullest extent permitted by the law provided, however, that no such invalidity shall in any way reduce services to be performed by the SERVICE PROVIDER to the FUND.

CAPTIONS: The captions or paragr aph headings contained in this Agreement are solely for purpose of convenience and shall not b e deemed part of this Agreement for the purpose of construing the meaning thereof or for any other purpose.
